

# What It's All About



Part C provides four core services:

- Child Find (identification/screening)
- Multi-Disciplinary Evaluation
- Family Support Planning
- Services Coordination.



Funding for services is provided by private insurance, Medicaid, categorical aid reimbursement (through U.S.D. 409), local resources and a state grant (Part C funds).



Referrals to the Infant-Toddler Program may come from families, physicians, professionals, or anyone interested in a child's development.

## What You Need to Know...

### What Is Part C & Who Can Receive Services?

Part C is a section of the federal law, Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), that contains a process for the provision of services to infants and toddlers (birth to 36 months) with delays or disabilities and to their families.

### How Will I Know If My Child Needs Such Services?

If you answer "yes" to any of the following questions, your child may qualify for services:

- ★ Does your child have special health or learning needs?
- ★ Was your child born with a very low birth weight?
- ★ Do you think your child is/was slow to begin crawling, walking, or talking?
- ★ Does your child have hearing, vision or feeding problems?
- ★ Does your child have problems relating to other people?
- ★ Does your child have a condition that may cause him/her to have a future delay in development?

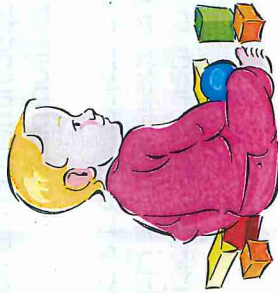

Parents of family members may request a developmental checkup (screening) for a child under age 3 years.

Screenings are available at the monthly Count Your Kid In developmental screening in collaboration with USD 409 or anytime by individual appointment in the home environment.



Anyone with a concern about a child is encouraged to speak with the Program Coordinator or their family physician.
